Dr Pedro Mendonça specialises in analysing the future of work with a focus on enhancing job quality in digital platform work, the gig economy, and supply chains. His recent research explores transnational labour mobility, precarious work, and their impact on employment relations, trade unions, and broader social movements. Pedro is currently involved in research projects evaluating Fair Work in Platform Work in Scotland and assessing the informalization of work within the platform economy.

Dr Anastasios Hadjisolomou (Tasos) is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Strathclyde, Scotland. His research interests include service employment, service triangle, customer misbehaviour, customer abuse, sexual harassment and violence in the workplace, LGBT+ issues in the workplace, employee voice and labour process theory. He co-led the formation of the Global Hospitality Research Alliance [GHRA]. His work has been published in journals such as the International Journal of Contemporary Hospitality Management, International Journal of Human Resource Management, Work, Employment and Society, Gender Work and Organization and Industrial Relations Journal.
